



Frequently Asked Questions Regarding the Salary Differentials for Engineering Titles

1. What titles have been approved for salary differentials?

To address recruitment and retention issues, the Division of Classification and Compensation and the Division of Budget approved salary differentials for professional engineers, architects, land surveyors, landscape architects, and geologists for all State agencies who utilize these titles.

2. What types of salary differentials were approved?

Two location specific differentials were approved: geographic pay differentials (Geos) and an increased hiring rate (IHR).

3. What is an increased hiring rate?

An increased hiring rate sets the hiring rate to a higher step in the pay schedule. The IHR approved for engineering titles has set the hiring rate at step 4. Any employee in these titles who is currently below step 4 will have their salary increased to step 4 and any new hires will be hired at step 4 immediately instead of the hiring rate. This approval does not cover trainee titles.

4. Which titles were approved for an increased hiring rate?

The IHR is location specific. Only people working in the following counties in the titles listed below will receive the approved IHR.

5. What is a geographic pay differential (Geo)?

A Geo is additional pay that is not considered part of an employee's base annual salary.

6. What titles were approved for a Geo and how much was approved?

People in one of the approved titles working in the following counties may receive up to a \$13,500 Geo.

All other counties were approved for a Geo of up to \$7,000.

While Geos are approved for a set amount, that amount is a maximum. When a Geo is approved for an agency, PEF expects that agencies will pay the full amount; however, they have several options. Agencies can decide to not pay the Geo, to pay an amount less than the full amount approved for the Geo, or to pay the full amount. Typically, agencies decide to pay the full amount, but that is not always the case.

If you are eligible for the Geo (see eligibility requirements above), you can contact your agency to confirm how much the Geo will be for you.

7. When will I see a change in my pay?

Initial payments to eligible employees will be processed on **01/23/2025** for those on the Institution payroll and **01/29/2025** for those on the Administration payroll.
